AFI recently upgraded our Solvent Still in order to manage solvent costs. We purchased and installed a new solvent reclaim system that allows us to completely recycle old solvents and even pull the usable solvents out of waste paints. The system also provides a paint gun cleaner that allows a painter to perform an initial clean with

used solvents and then perform a final rinse with a mist of fresh solvent. The system is replenished with recycled solvent on a regular basis. We aim to use this system to improve quality because painters can keep guns in "top-notch" condition. We are also excited to be able to control today's rising solvent cost and help our environment at the same time.

1. Tuba Player– Ted Schreyer is a match (picture #1 above). Ted comes from a very musical family. His dad was a well known banjo player, and his sister actually makes her living playing the banjo. Ted runs a band named the "Blue Ox Jazz Babies" in Mankato. Ted also plays with several jazz bands in the Twin Cities and Rochester. They play at many summer events around Minnesota every year and were the featured band at the Moon Dogs baseball game that AFI attended this summer. Ted's musical career began when he was in high school playing in school functions and accompanying his father and sister at various events. Although he "covers all the basses", the tuba is Ted's favorite instrument. Ted shared that the most interesting place he played was on the "The Prairie Home Companion" radio show. He was also a back up instrumentalist for Marilyn Sellers when she sang, "One Day at a Time" at an event held in Minnesota. Ted has worked at AFI for 30 years and is our V.P. of Operations. (His 30 years were recognized in our last newsletter). What he loves most about AFI are the people, explaining that he has been blessed to work with great customers and co-workers.

2. Owns Obligotto Recording Studio-Mike Reinarts is a match (picture #2 above). I had the opportunity to visit Mike at his studio in rural New Ulm, Minnesota. Mike has been a member of a band most of his adult life. Drums are his favorite instrument, but he plays the guitar also. Mike has always had an interest in recording music. He has written and produced several of his own songs. Mike and his dad built his studio, which is attached to his home. Currently Mike is working on a project for a company that sells books on audio tape (cd's). Mike hires an acting student from MSU to read the books, and they have done a few demo tapes, it sounds like they liked what they heard. Mikes studio is not complete yet, he needs to add some acoustical equipment yet and many more small items to meet with his satisfaction. Mike has worked at AFI for 12 years, he is our most seasoned liquid painter.

3. Glass Blower—Bob Doring is a match (picture # 3 below). Bob began glass blowing after college. Bob graduated from MSU in 1973 with a BAF, he holds a Graduate Assistant Degree (GAD) from Virginia Commonwealth University in Richmond, Virginia. Bob has a studio in his home, which has a main furnace, pot furnace for color, and a glory hole for reheating glass while he is working. These ovens average a temperature of 2400 degrees. He also has a Anneling oven for cooling glass which is only at 900 degrees. (Sounds weird eh?). Bob has designed and made many of his own tools. He was a featured glass blower at the Renaissance Fair from 1976-1987, he was the very first featured glass blower at the festival. Bob shared the most interesting piece he made was the back half of a bumble bee, the front half was made in Germany in the late 1920's. The piece is in the collection of Horst Rechelbacher, founder of Aveda. Bob sells his pieces mostly from his home studio. He does display some of his work in a store in St. Peter and he attends two shows a year. The average cost of Bob's work costs between \$30 and \$90. Bob started working at AFI July of 2007. Bob loves the varied scope of the job and likes the unique individuals he has the opportunity to interact with at AFI.
